poverty.

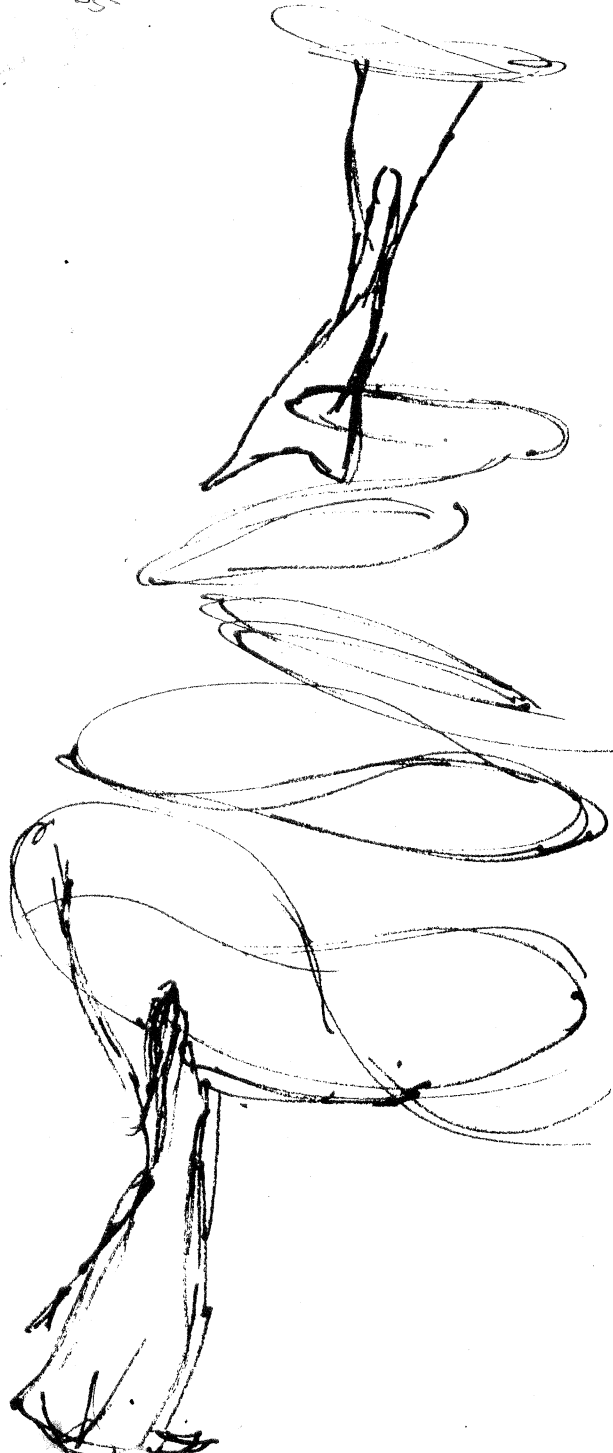
